Jaycie Timms has been a Girl Scout for 13 years and was a member of Troop 1327 in Service Unit 634. She is currently a freshman at Johnson County Community College.

Jaycie's Gold Award project addressed a lack of awareness in her community about being able to raise chickens within the city limits. A new ordinance had passed that allowed locals to raise chickens on their property and Jaycie felt that the city did not do enough to announce this change. She held an educational, free class at a local supply store called "Hens 101" and several people bought supplies to start their own coops after the course. In addition to the class, she created a poster for Nancy Carr's egg project and posted it in local classrooms. She feels that raising hens can be beneficial for families and communities like hers.

Jaycie worked with professionals at her high school and in her district as well as the owner of Mack True Value where "Hens 101" was held. She also worked with Nancy Carr's egg project on the design of an informational poster that the organization had wanted to create, but had not had the resources to do so previously. She is excited to have her project continue with community locals who have agreed to continue hosting "Hens 101" and by educating children in the classrooms where the posters were placed.
