



## Junior Drawing Badge

**Pillar:** Civic Engagement/Life Skills

**Outcomes:** Strong sense of self

### Juniors will earn their badge by:

1. Experiment with different materials
  - a. Draw a still life (an object that doesn't move like a bowl of fruit or a vase). Experiment using different drawing tools such as pencils, pens, colored pencils, or crayons. Draw your still life three times and each time use a different tool or "medium".

2. Learn how to add shading.
  - a. Use hatching and crosshatching to shade a face drawing.

3. Get some perspective
  - a. Draw an outdoor scene. First, draw a horizon line across your page. Then, imagine you're standing right in front of your picture. Make the objects close to you look biggest and draw objects smaller as they get closer to the horizon.

4. Use your imagination like a graphic artist
  - a. Draw a new cover for your favorite book or music album. What do the words or lyrics mean to you? How would you show that in a drawing?
5. Make your masterpiece and show it off!
  - a. Share one of your drawings in the GSKSMO Virtual Art Show (see below). If you decide to make several drawings you can create a special art scrapbook for yourself, called a portfolio.
