

Costumes for Give Kids the World

Logan improved her sewing techniques and was able to donate four capes and ponchos, five skirts, seven scarves, two top hats, two patterns and a book of examples. Logan traveled to Florida to deliver the costumes in person and plans on returning to GKTW in December to be a volunteer in the holiday parade!
