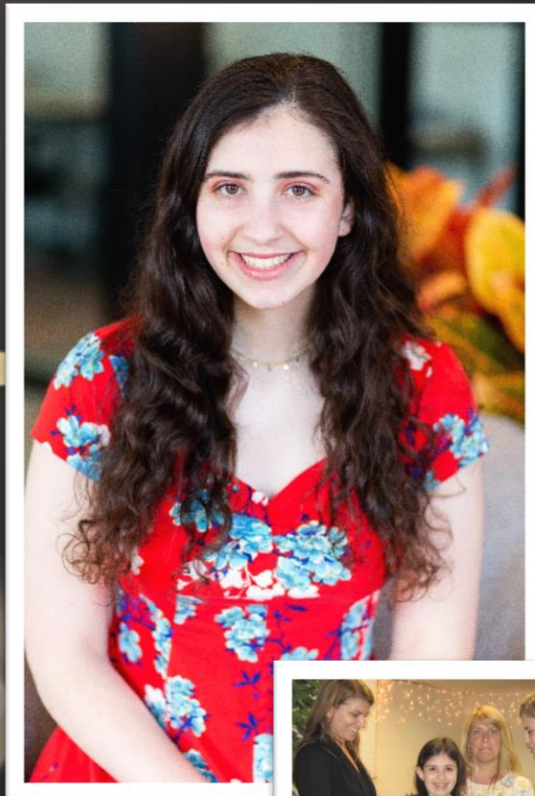




Ceresa Munjak-Khoury

Water and Waste Management

Ceresa's Gold Award project addressed the need for a more ecofriendly alternative to single use cup options at a summer camp. After realizing how many single-use cups were being discarded at camp, Ceresa decided to combat the issue by installing water fountains that would provide students water without needing cups. This project reduced the amount of waste created by the camp and eliminated an expense of the single-use cups.

Ceresa worked with Rainbow School to develop and install her project, as well as figure out the most sustainable solution. As someone focused on reducing waste, Ceresa knew that making this sustainable change would have a lasting, positive impact on her community and the planet. In addition, she educated campers on the change and the importance of everyone taking small steps to reduce the amount of trash in landfills.
