Pillar: Civic Engagement

Outcomes: When you've earned this badge, you will have expanded your knowledge about how your local, state, and national government works.



These are new badges released this year from GSUSA. These steps are meant to be a basis for building background knowledge so that we add progression as you become familiar with the content. If you are ready for more, see the Democracy for Cadette, Senior and Ambassador Extensions! There you can begin your progression!

Cadettes, Seniors and Ambassadors will follow these steps to earn their badge:

1. Find out about local government. (Discover, Connect)
 - a. Who is your Mayor? What does she/he do? How and when is one elected? How could they be removed?
 - b. Who is on your City Council? Find out who your representative is. How and when are they elected? How could one be removed?
 - c. Find out when they meet and attend a city council meeting.
2. Find out about state government. (Discover, Connect)
 - a. Who is your Governor? What does she/he do? What city is he or she from? How and when is the Governor elected? How can a Governor be removed?
 - b. Find out who your Representatives are. Who is your House Representative? Who is your Senate Representative? What do they each do? How and when are they elected? How could they be removed?
