Pillar: STEAM

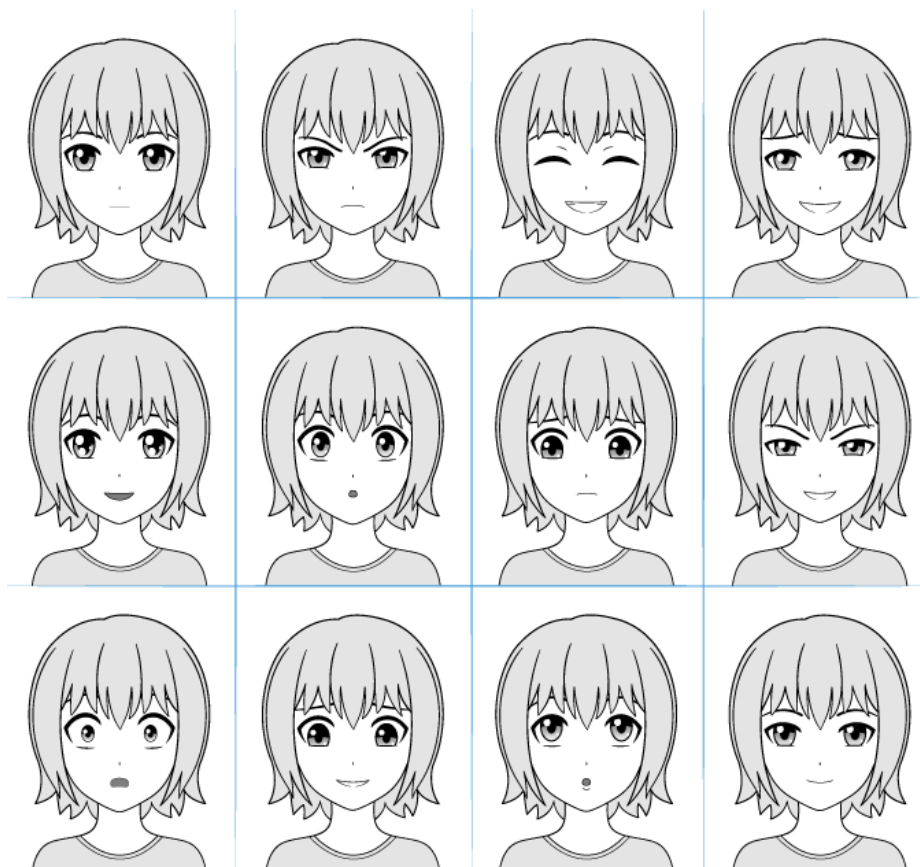
When you have earned the Junior Drawing Badge, you'll know some great drawing techniques.

Drawing is at the heart or soul of an artist's way to express themselves. As a communication tool, drawing is a creative tool to express the feelings and thoughts of an artist or designer. Art is created from all kinds of visions and perspectives. To celebrate Thinking Day we are adapting the drawing badge to learn more about Manga.



Juniors will earn their badge by:

1. Experiment with different materials (Discover)
 - a. Learn about different types of drawing mediums: pencils, colored pencils, graphite pencils, charcoal pencils, pens, tech pens, nibs, markers, or crayons

2. Learn how to add shading. (Discover)

3. Get some perspective (Discover)
