

# Cookie Meetings

## Daisy Troop Meeting 1

This meeting is all about getting to know the cookies! In this meeting girls will learn to recognize each of the Girl Scout cookies and packages by name. Girls will try the new cookie and be able to speak about it.

*This virtual meeting plan will last 30–45 minutes.  
Feel free to end early if you complete all the activities.  
\*\*By completing all four of these cookie meetings with your troop, the girls will earn their Count It Up Leaf!\*\**



### Supplies:

- New cookie, Toast-Yays provided to you by your Service Unit Product Program Manager.
- Cookie graphics (part of this document) for each girl
- 8 Popsicle sticks or card shaped strips of paper for each girl
- Scissors
- Glue

### Prepare ahead:

- Provide popsicle sticks or paper and cookie graphics via porch pick-up or give the link to parents with a list of the materials above to have everything ready for the meeting.
- Divide up the Toast-Yays into a small baggie for each girl.

### Virtual Meeting Plan

Ask parents to start the log-on process five minutes early.

#### Connect

As girls log on, greet each one by name and ask them to show they understand the platform features, like mute/unmute and raise hand. Unmute them all and give girls a chance to chat.

Note who is missing from the virtual meeting and send parents a reminder text, if feasible.

#### Opening

Call everyone to attention as you open the meeting.

You can display an image of the US Flag on the screen for the girls to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

You can have the words of the Promise displayed on the screen as you say it.

#### Activities

##### 1. Game: Learn about the Toast-Yays through our senses!

- Each girl pulls out the baggie with the cookie sealed inside. The cookie stays inside, and the baggie will remain closed until you instruct otherwise! As you read the following directions, the girls will indicate their thoughts by showing a thumb-up, thumb-sideways or a thumb-down. They will elaborate when asked *why*.
- First, LOOK at the cookie. Turn it around in your hand. Look at both sides. What do you see? What do you think about the way it looks? (show of thumbs) Why? (allow girls to answer)



- Second, LISTEN as I say the name, “Toast-Yays.” What do you think of the name? (show of thumbs) Why?
- Third, open the bag but leave the cookie in it. SMELL the cookie. What do you think about how the cookie smells? Why?
- Fourth, take out the cookie and FEEL the trefoil. Take a bite and TASTE it! What do you think? Why?
- When a customer asks what a Toast-Yay tastes like, what will you tell them? If you do not care for it, how can you talk about the cookie in a nice way?
- Girls finish their cookie.

## 2. Cookie activity: Meet the Cookies!

- Print off the cookie graphics at the end of this page to create puppets with your troop. Have girls cut around each cookie and each package and glue them to a popsicle stick, or piece of paper etc. with the cookie on top and the package below. Use these to familiarize your girls with each of the cookies. Talk to the girls about what each of the cookies taste like.
- Practice holding up the cookie and using its name.
- “This is a Thin Mint.” “This is our new cookie; it’s called a Toast-Yay.”
- Practice holding up the cookie and saying what it tastes like.
- “Thin Mints are chocolate and mint.” “Toast-Yays taste like Cinnamon Toast Cereal.” “Peanut Butter Patties are peanut butter and chocolate.” “Caramel Delights are coconut and caramel.” Etc.

Ask girls to return any items from the meeting to their proper place after you log off.

### Closing/Reflection

Ask each girl to tell one thing she has learned from attending the meeting. Each girl can then voice one thing she is excited about during cookie season.
