Through this Civics Badge series girls gain an in-depth understanding of how local, state, and federal government works, equipping them to be voters, activists, and even political leaders. They also research their own government officials and are encouraged to meet them.

As your Girl Scout(s) begin the new Civics Badge for her/their grade level, you should first access the badge requirements through the badge booklet or the Volunteer Toolkit (VTK).
