

Water pollution is an environmental concern that impacts our daily lives as humans who need water to survive. In order to spread awareness and education about water pollution and how to reduce pollution in her community, Emily created an educational presentation for juniors and seniors at her high school.

As an action step for students who participated in her lesson, Emily gave them instructions to build a water filter from disposable and recyclable materials that commonly pollute bodies of water. Her hope is that through this educational program students from Olathe South will be better stewards of the environment.

Through Olathe South's curriculum, championed by Ms. Radakovich, a science instructor at the school, this presentation will be taught in upcoming school years, keeping the information and goals of the project alive for many years.
